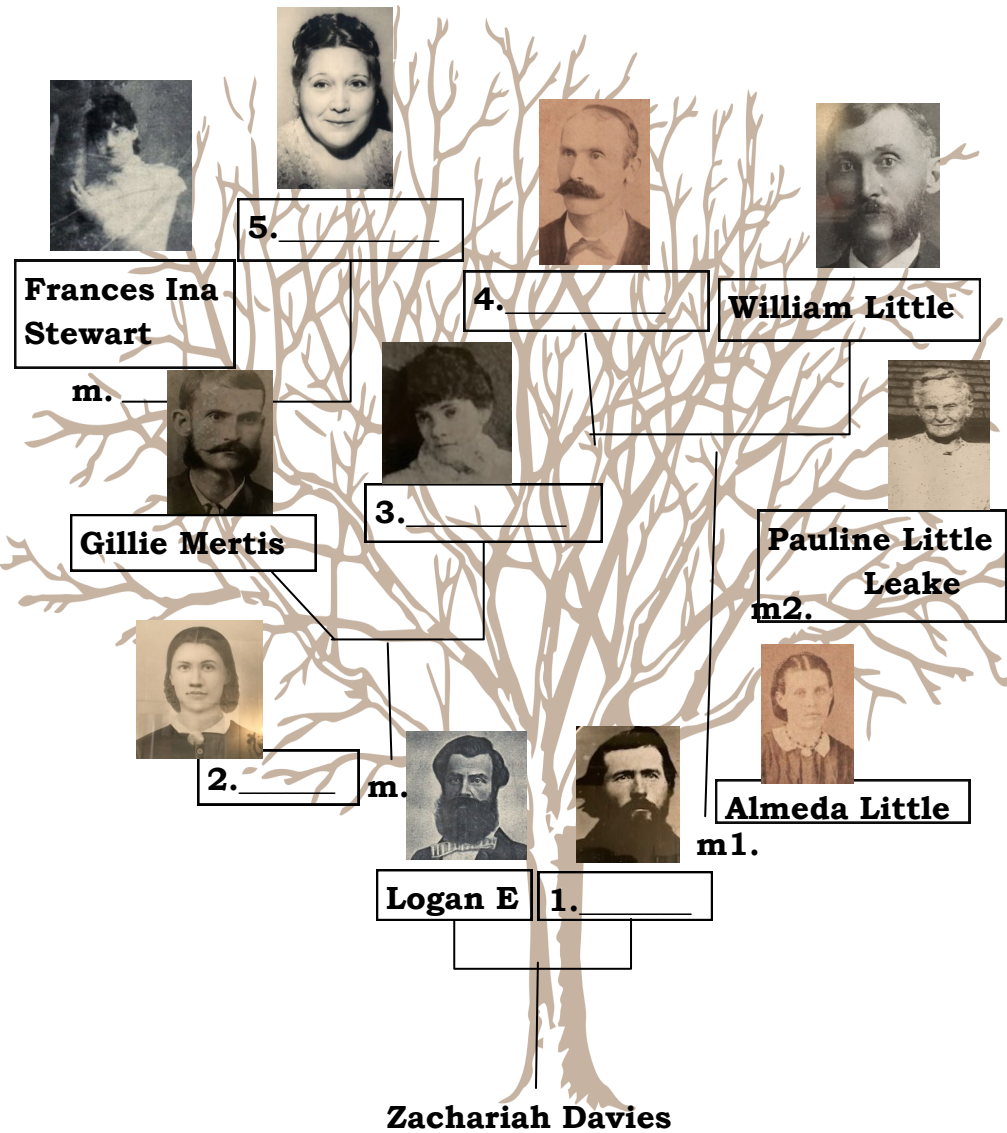

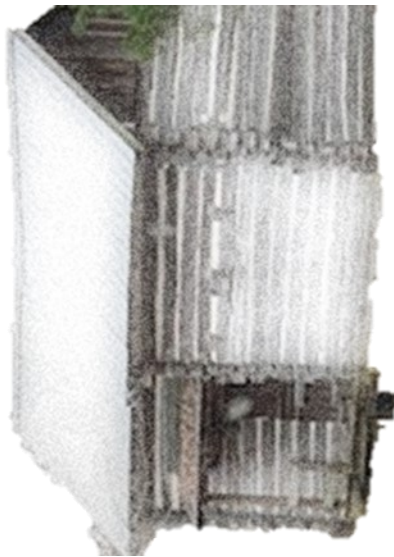
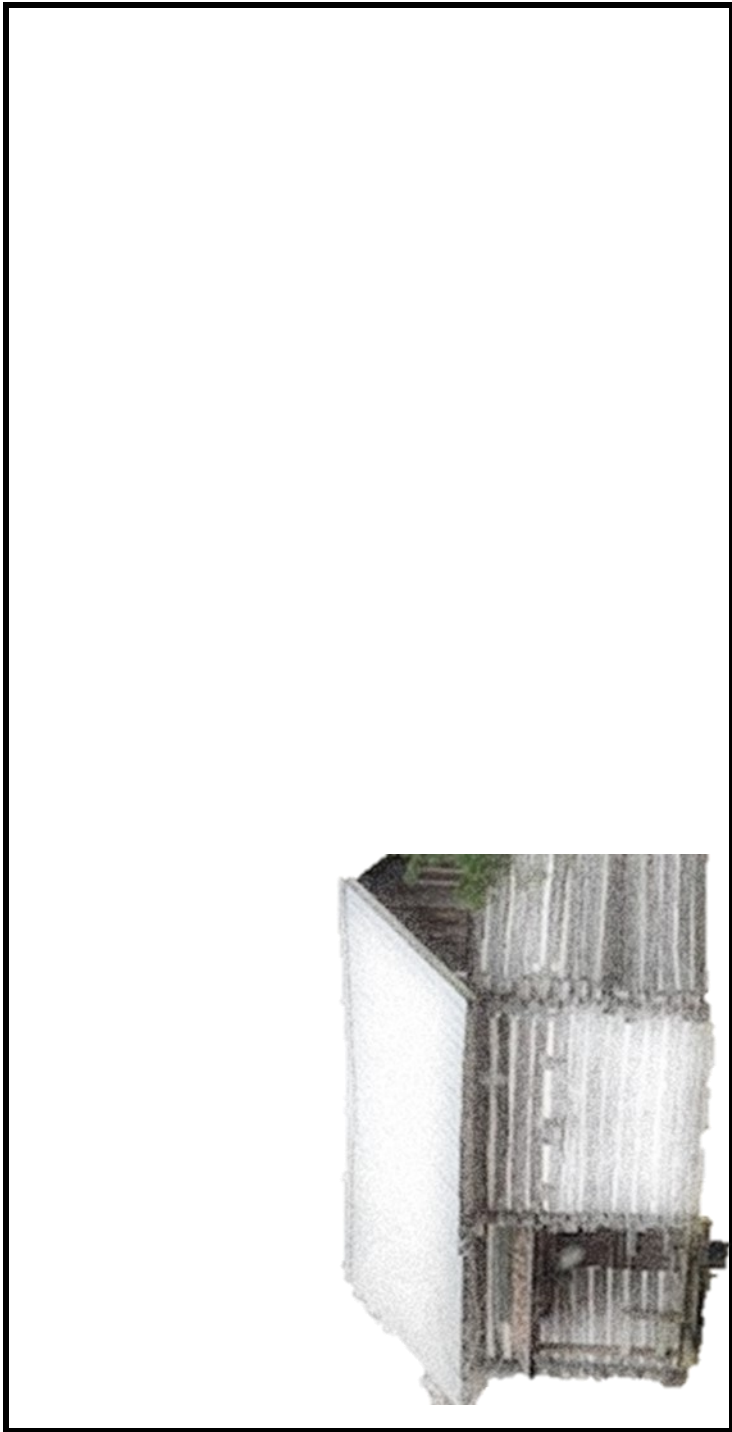


Davies Family Tree

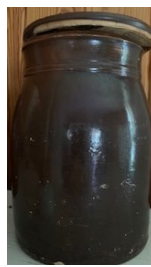

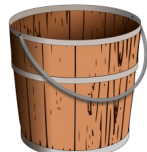
